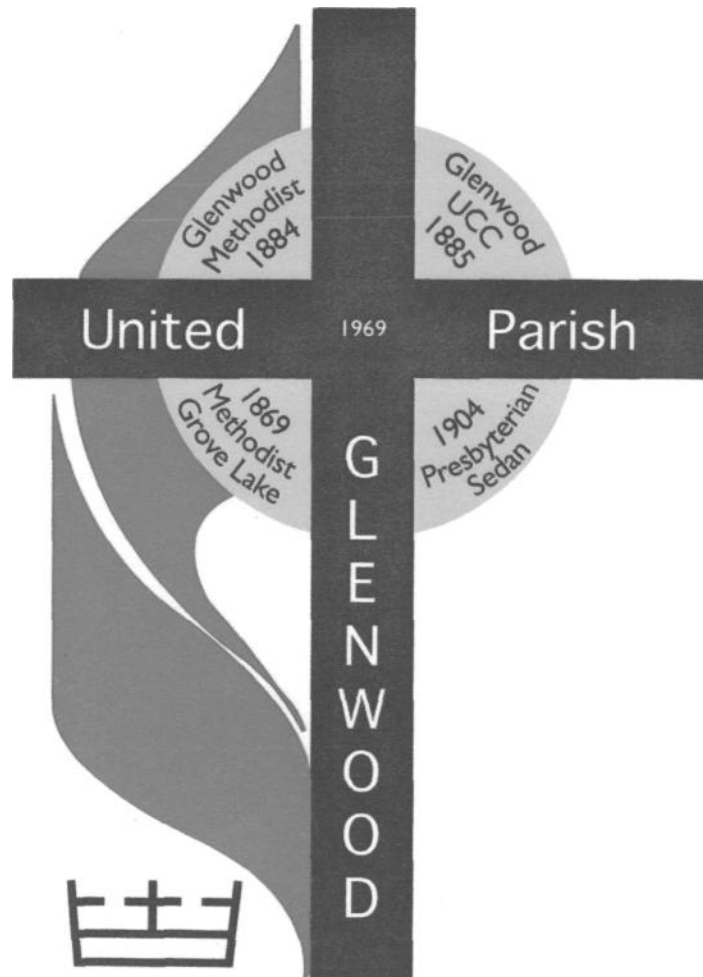

## **Glenwood United Parish**

### **Annual Meeting Minutes - January 23, 2011**

The meeting was called to order by Council Vice-Chairman, Dick Benson. Rev Grage led us in prayer. A quorum was present (10% of church membership). An attendance sheet was passed around and the agenda approved.

Motion by Jon Stafsholt, seconded by Cody Rogahn to approve minutes of the 2010 Annual Meeting as printed. Motion carried.

Motion by Lee Paulson, seconded by Carl Sudbrink to approve Treasurer's Report as presented with corrections by Gene Herdebu. Motion carried.

Miscellaneous Reports: Dick Benson indicated to the congregation there is a current liability suit against the church and it is being handled by the church's liability company and their attorney. It involves the previous pastor of Glenwood United Parish. There were no further questions. Darby Bowen gave a report representing the Pulpit Committee. Their recommendation is to move forward with securing a full-time minister. Miscellaneous reports approved.

Motion by Dean Paulson, seconded by Rita Benson to recess the Meeting of the Congregation. Motion carried. The Meeting of the Corporation was called to order. Cody Rogahn gave a report on the 2011 Budget. Motion by Helen Stafsholt, seconded by Barb Herdebu to approve the 2011 Budget as printed. Motion carried. The Meeting of the Corporation was adjourned and the Meeting of the Congregation reconvened.

Dean Paulson, representing the Nominating Committee, presented the Slate of Candidates for 2011. He noted that Cheryl Petek will share Missions Committee with Nellie Anderson. Motion by Dean Paulson, seconded by Helen Stafsholt to accept names as printed. Discussion followed on open spots with a request for volunteers. Darby Bowen is off Parish Tellers (she is Financial Secretary); Helen Stafsholt volunteered for the position. The Trust Fund Officers has two openings; (Jon Stafsholt should be listed as still on, Dean Paulson and Cody Rogahn are off), Karen Haus and Bill Bowen volunteered to fill the vacancies. There is one position open on the

Nominating Committee; Cody Rogahn volunteered. Motion by Gene Herdebu, seconded by Cody Rogahn to cast a unanimous ballot for the Slate of Candidates with corrections as noted and those who volunteered. Motion carried.

Motion made by Beth Snider, seconded by Bill Bowen to make exemption to by-laws to allow Gene Herdebu as Treasurer for 4<sup>th</sup> term. Motion carried.

Motion by Carl Sudbrink, seconded by Lee Paulson to reaffirm Nellie Anderson and Doug Reker as lay speakers for 2011. Motion carried.

Pastor Grage gave closing comments and led us in table grace. Motion by Helen Stafsholt, seconded by Shirley Schramm to adjourn. Motion carried. A pot luck lunch followed.

## **COUNCIL CHAIR**

This was the year of our transition from part time interim ministry to full time ministry. Rev. Duane Grage and Sue Grage finished their roles with us on March 31. Rev. Jeffrey Ozanne began his tour as our full time minister on April 1, 2011. He and his wife Marianne moved into the parsonage. She is the minister at the Sauk Centre United Methodist Church. The two of them early on invited members of our congregation to gatherings at the parsonage to get to know each other.

In the fall of 2010, we began to renovate the basement of the church by removing the carpeting and the tiles from the hallway. New carpeting and vinyl flooring was laid in the hallway, the bathrooms and the north office space in early spring. A drainage and water seepage problem was discovered with the spring rains. This was solved by removing the old black top from the south of the church, grading the slope and laying new black top so the water drains away from the foundation. Other repairs were made to the parsonage.

Pastor Jeff initiated a process for long range planning for the church. We started by using an assessment tool from Natural Church Development. After reviewing the result, the Council met to set some goals for the coming year. These goals will be presented at the Annual Meeting on January 8, 2012 and hopefully adopted by the congregation for 2012.

Mission has played a prominent role in the activities of the church this year. Evangelism/Mission/Social Concerns Committee identified Back Pack Attack support as an important need in the community. This is a program that provides supplementary food for low income students in the school district that they can receive during the summer months. Funds to pay for this program were raised from individual donations, our Spring Pork Chop dinner proceeds and fund raisers on the Lake Minnewaska pontoons. "Imagine NO Malaria" is another mission project brought to our attention by the Committee and funds were raised at a Sunday afternoon concert at the church. The Sunday School spearheaded a food drive in November which benefited the Hearts and Hands Food Shelf.

The church has come alive this year with our new minister. He has started a series of small group sessions on books, current topics and even on Harry Potter. He cares for members of our congregation and also has involved himself in the life of our community. He gave the opening prayer at the Memorial Day program and has joined Glenwood Rotary to increase the presence of our church in community activities. Even our Sunday School kids give him big hugs.

We have turned the corner on the lawsuit brought against our church, Glenwood United Parish, Minnesota Conference of United Church of Christ and our former minister Rev. Gregory Kappahn. A mediation meeting was held in St. Cloud on September 8, 2011 where we were represented by our insurance company and our attorney. A settlement was reached at that time and the action became official on November 15, 2011. The church has no further claims against it in this matter. We are sorry that things happened as they did and hope that time and healing has occurred and that lessons have been learned.

I want to thank all Council members and committee members who make things happen in our parish. Thanks also to all members who support the church in financial matters and in time and energy. We have a good start with our new minister and things look bright for our parish. Again, Thank you. David Peterson, Council Chair

## **EVANGELISM, MISSIONS AND SOCIAL CONCERNS**

It has been an exciting year for our committee. We have focused on both local and international missions. The "Backpack Attack" provides food for Pope County Children in need on the weekend. We partnered with the United Way, North Country Food Bank, and the public schools. Our church raised \$3,723.24 from two Lake Minnewaska boat trips and your generosity. 11 provided for the summer distributions and two weekends a month during the school year (previously not covered).

In the fall, we initiated the "Imagine No Malaria" program. The United Methodist Church and the Global Fund are partnering to fight malaria in Africa. We started our efforts with information in the newsletter and during the church service. Pure Country Band donated their time for a concert in October, and we raised \$716.00. We will continue with our commitment to "Imagine No Malaria" for three years.

7. Goals for the upcoming year have been discussed. Increased membership and increasing involvement of more lay people in our worship services were some of the goals set for this coming year.

## **PASTOR'S REPORT**

Looking Back and Looking Ahead: FDR was famous for his first 100 days, a whirlwind period of time in his first year in office where monumental pieces of legislation were passed in order to quickly try and fix the problems of the Great Depression. Since then, the idea of quickly working for change has moved in and out of style in politics, business, and the church. As I look back over my first 100 days, and really my first 275 days here in Glenwood I cannot say I have the same sort of success to point to. I also did not come into a church suffering from the equivalent of the Great Depression. I would say that a better analogy would be a church awakening from hibernation.

Over the last nine months I have watched the church come to life as together we have begun to do some amazing things. We taken on two mission projects, Backpack Attack and Imagine NO Malaria, we have seen a consistent increase in our worship attendance, and perhaps most excitingly we have seen our children participate in a variety of activities, from confirmation, to youth group, to Sunday morning worship. I cannot personally take credit for these events but have tried to do my best to harness and inspire the energy I have seen bubbling around me.

This fall we took a congregational survey to give ourselves a better sense of how we are doing as a church, kind of like a yearly physical that many of us undergo at the doctor's office. We learned a number of things from the survey and also had some obvious things confirmed. Not surprisingly we found that our church does not provide a lot of small group opportunities, something we were already aware of. Two surprises to me were people's expectations of worship and our attention to personal devotions. While we expressed general satisfaction with worship, there was not much anticipation of it; people were not looking forward to worship during the week. (But we were happy we when we worshipped) Through conversations with people during "Meet the Pastor" sessions and other avenues I have found our church to be full of people with deep faith. Our study however revealed that many of us struggle with personal devotions. Based on these results we are looking to 2012 with some clear areas to improve on.

Each one of us has a personal faith journey. No church program, worship service, or the efforts of a pastor can make that journey for us. What we can do as a community is provide opportunities for each of us to grow together in faith. We can help each other improve our personal devotions; we can work to build up excitement for our worship service; we can join in small groups with each other. We can grow in faith together.

2011 was a year of getting to know each other, a chance for you to meet me as a pastor and me to meet you as a congregation. It has been a blessing already to be working with some many wonderful and diverse people. I believe we have enormous potential as a congregation to do great things and be a transformative force in the community, and in our own faith journeys. As I look back at 2011 I am amazed at what we have accomplished and truly excited about what is to come!
